FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

This weekend the Gospel text is part of Jesus' "farewell discourse" during his Last Supper with his disciples. Jesus explains to his apostles how

they and their disciples can carry on when he is no longer bodily or physically present. Jesus assures them, using the parable of the vine and branches. Jesus tells his disciples, "I am the true vine" (Jn 15, 1). "You are the branches... Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit." He says "cut off from me, you can do nothing" (Jn15, 5). This is an absolute truth; no believer can achieve anything of spiritual value outside of Christ. Life ebbs away. But in Jesus we have life in abundance.

How do we remain in Jesus? When we spend quiet, quality time with him in prayer. When we honor the commandments, exercise acts of love, kindness and mercy in the name of Jesus. We remain in Jesus. Prayer takes one to have a deep and personal conversation with Jesus who is real, alive and present to us as we pray, reflect, speak and listen to Him. When we love others, we love Jesus himself. Pray that we may remain in HIM so that we may bear much fruit.

May 1st, is the Feast of Saint Joseph the Worker, the patronal feast day of our diocese. I wish you happy feast of Saint Joseph the Worker. The Memorial of Saint Joseph the Worker has been celebrated liturgically since 1955. On this day the Church, inspired by Saint Joseph's example and under his patronage, commemorates in a special way the human and supernatural value of work. Month of May is also a month dedicated to the devotion to our blessed mother. May our blessed mother bless everyone with health and companionship.

Confession – a preparation for receiving the Eucharist

The best way to prepare to receive Jesus in the Holy Eucharist is by going to Confession (also known as the Sacrament of Reconciliation, Penance). We want to receive Him with a clean heart. If it is not possible to go to Confession before receiving Jesus, make a sincere Act of Contrition in your heart, and as always pray with sincerity the prayer at Mass, "I confess to Almighty God..." A sin that is mortal – serious or grave – requires Sacramental Confession before receiving Holy Communion. If you are not sure about this, speak with a priest. Let's pray this right now and every day this week:

Jesus, please give me the grace to be truly sorry for my sins. This week read how God calls us out of darkness into His own wonderful light in 1 Peter 2:9-10.

~9-day Novena to the Holy Spirit:

Friday, May 10 through Saturday, May 18, 2024

A Novena consists of praying a prayer during a period of nine days for a specific intention. The first Novena took place after Jesus ascended into Heaven. Jesus told the Apostles and Mary to go back and wait and pray in the Upper Room until He would "send the Promise of my Father [the Holy Spirit] upon you; stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." (Luke 24:49) The Holy Spirit came with incredible power on Pentecost to fulfill the promise of Jesus. Join together as a family to pray a 9-day Novena from May 10 - 18 leading up to Pentecost, Sunday, May 19th. Jesus is the True Vine

Jesus says that He is the vine and we are the branches. Branches grow out from a vine and receive their food from the main stem. They grow leaves and bear fruit.



Our souls get their life from Jesus. When we stay united with Him then our souls are healthy and able to do good works, like the grapes that grow on a healthy vine.

Doing a serious sin

is like cutting oneself off of the main vine. The nutrition can't flow into the branch because it's cut off! The branch can't grow leaves or fruit and it withers and dries up. Even though you can't see it, that is what happens to a soul that doesn't have God's life coming into it.

Sometimes a branch of a vine needs to be pruned.

A bit gets cut off, but then it grows even better where it was cut. In the same way, sometimes God lets us suffer, but then our souls can grow even stronger and bear more good fruit. Next time you are
