

# **Third Sunday** of Lent

# ~ Stewardship Reflection ~

Today's Gospel passage reminds us that life is precious and the gift of time on this earth is just that — a gift. Let's take a moment to reflect on this profound truth. None of us knows how much time we have, so we must use this gift intentionally to glorify God and serve our neighbor.

Jesus offers the parable of the fig tree to illustrate this truth further. The owner of the orchard came searching for fruit on a fig tree he had planted in his orchard. Finding no fruit on the tree after three years, he told the gardener to cut it down. But the gardener intercedes and asks for one more year to cultivate and fertilize the tree, hoping it will bear fruit. The fig tree was not dying; it simply wasn't doing much of anything at all. Can this be said of us and our lives as well?

The season of Lent is a time to carefully reflect on how we spend our time. Do we make God our priority, tending to our spiritual growth and sacramental life with diligence? Do we give the next priority to our loved ones, focusing intentionally on them each day without distractions from phones, screens, or thoughts of work? If not, now is the moment to repent of our waste of time or misplaced priorities on our use of time. Remember, God is merciful but just. Let's turn to Him and ask Him to make our lives fruitful while we still have time, knowing that our potential for spiritual growth is limitless with His grace.



# What is a Jubilee?

The concept comes from the Old where Testament. commanded its observance every 50th year (Lev. 25:10). The Vatican states, "A Jubilee Year is above all the year of Christ, who brings life and grace humanity." During this Jubilee year, you are invited to pray for

greater hope. Ask God to increase the gift of hope in You. Further, make simple acts of hope by saying "For You O Lord are my hope...my trust is in You" (Ps. 146:5)
