

~ PASTOR LETTER ~



First Sunday of Lent

The Season Lent has begun. This is a time of penance, purification, and conversion. Every first Sunday of Lent brings us meditation on Jesus being led by the Holy Spirit into the wilderness, where He

faces intense temptations from the devil. This happens immediately after his Baptism by John in the Jordan. The fact that Jesus spent 40 days in the desert is significant. This recalls the 40 years that the Israelites wandered in the desert after being led from slavery in Egypt to freedom.

This episode of Jesus in the wilderness not only reveals Christ's victory over sin and His total reliance on the Word of God, but it also serves as a powerful reminder that our journey of faith requires perseverance, trust, and active engagement with God's grace. Jesus' resistance to temptation is a testament to His active commitment to the Father's will.

In our own faith journey this lent, let's reflect on how we can resist the "temptations of the wilderness" in our lives. Let this lent be a special time to exam how each of us is living our Christian life. Let these days be a time of spiritual renewal. Let these be a time to participate in the Mass either in person or virtually every day. Let it be a time of personal prayer, reading the Holy Scripture, setting aside some of our blessings to be a blessing to others. Let these be a time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation; participate in the "Stations of the Cross"; join the Bible Study being offered at our school hall visiting the sick and those in nursing homes and doing some acts of charity, kindness, and mercy.
