

~ PASTOR LETTER ~





On Palm Sunday, we enter the holiest week of the year, walking with our Lord as He journeys to the Cross and to the morning of the Resurrection. Today's readings

reveal the profound courage of Jesus, who endured humiliation, suffering, and death to fulfill the will of the Father. They invite us to reflect on our own call to courageously follow God's will, even when it is difficult or demands sacrifice.

From the Last Supper to His betrayal, trial, and crucifixion, Jesus remains steadfast in His mission. Knowing the suffering ahead, He prays in the garden, "Father, if you are willing, take this cup away from me; still, not my will but yours be done." Jesus accepts the Cross with unwavering courage, showing that discipleship often involves embracing trials for God's greater plan. Even as Jesus enters Jerusalem in triumph, with crowds cheering and waving palms, He knows what awaits Him – a stark contrast to the joy of this moment. Yet He moves forward with courage, fully aware that His obedience to the Father is the path to salvation for humanity.

Gospel challenges us to consider our own response to God's will. Discipleship may require sacrifices, but God's grace sustains us every step of the way. But remember Cross is not the end of the story. Cross opens the way to resurrection and new life. As we enter Holy Week, let us pray for the courage to embrace God's will in our lives, even when it is difficult. Let us fix our eyes on Christ, who walked this path before us and who walks with us still.

On Tuesday, April 15, Bishop Battersby will gather with all the priests of our diocese to bless the Holy Oils of Catechumens, Chrism and Oil of the Sick at the cathedral. Please try to take part of the chrism mass celebrations.

In addition to being Palm Sunday, this weekend is very special for me because this will be the last weekend when I celebrate mass for both the parishes as Msgr. Hundt will be at St Joseph for Easter Triduum. He has been appointed as Priest Moderator for St. Joseph and St. Peter Parishes.

Thanks to the PCCW at St Joseph for all the extra steps that they have taken to make my last weekday mass on April 22 memorable. Also, thanks to all those who are going to be at St Peter on 15th April for the Passover soup supper. Hope to see you there. THANK YOU

always. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave His Apostles – the first priests – the command to repeat His actions and words: to "do this in memory of Me." The presence of Christ, by the change of bread and wine in becoming His Body and Blood, takes place by the power of Jesus' Word and the Holy Spirit. The priest, in the role of



Christ through his ordination, pronounces the words of Jesus but their power and grace are God's. At Mass, as the priest speaks the words of Jesus, the bread and wine become His Body and Blood by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus wants us to receive Him at Mass every Sunday because He wants to live in our heart. Let's pray this right now and every day this week. Thank you Jesus for Father Biju as he stands in for You, and thereby, we are able to receive You in Holy Communion at Mass. This week, read the passage of Jesus instituting the Holy Eucharist at the Last Supper in Matthew 26:26-28.
